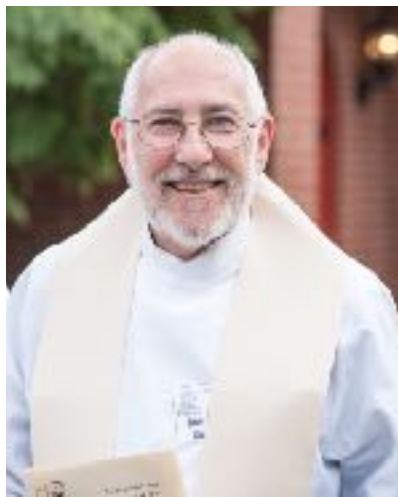

We are approaching the end of Lent. It is a season that may be described as bookends.

We begin with Ash Wednesday and end with Easter. We go from being reminded on Ash Wednesday that we are dust, we shall return to dust, but God loves us in spite of the fact that, or because, we are dust. We end

on Easter morning with the glorious resurrection: though we're dust, God's power and love can transform us and the world.

Lent is a journey we take together each year from one bookend to the other. It's not always an easy one, but we make it as a group, a family, a church, and we make it with Easter always in sight.

We walk with God and each other as we deny ourselves, fast, pray, and meditate on the scriptures. We walk with the goal not of just arriving at Easter, but of being transformed along the way so that the dust that began the journey on Ash Wednesday is not the same as the dust that arrives on Easter morning.

## *From the Minutes of the March 13 Vestry Meeting*

Charles Duke and Marilyn Slocumbe were thanked for the success of the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper.

The treasurer's report for February was presented and reviewed. Discussion took place about the amount of the diocesan pledge and how it is assessed. Fr. John noted the difficulty of getting the assessment reduced by the diocese. Motion was made and seconded to accept as presented; motion passed unanimously.

There was no senior warden's report. Marilyn Slocumbe, junior warden, reported that Danny Bessinger at First Methodist has volunteered to help find a wireless sound amplification system for Fr. John to use.

Fr. John presented the rector's report. He stated that ten people had come by to receive "ashes to go" on Ash Wednesday and that the joint service with First Methodist went well, as did the first Lenten soup supper. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunrise services will be done jointly with First Methodist.

Bishop Wimberley will be here on June 11. The vestry agreed they would like for the whole congregation to have the opportunity to meet with him and for the meal after the service to be catered by Renee Hunt. Fr. John also pointed out there will be two confirmations at Bishop Wimberley's visit, Katherine Berg and Christine Colbert.

Fr. John also stated that annual council will be in Gainesville November 10-11 and will be hosted by the Northeast Georgia Convocation for the first time since 2004. St. Alban's will be asked for volunteers for some of the hosting tasks. We will also need to provide delegates as usual; Marilyn Slocumbe and Suzanne Moore expressed willingness to act as delegates if others do not volunteer to do so.

Also under new business, Charles Duke asked that vestry meeting time be changed to a Sunday after church, noting that Sunday afternoons would be especially better for Natasha Clay, who has a long drive between home and St. Alban's and her workplace. After some discussion, the vestry agreed to try this out, but to meet at 6 on Monday evening as usual on April 10, then decide at that time which Sunday afternoon would be suitable for a May meeting.

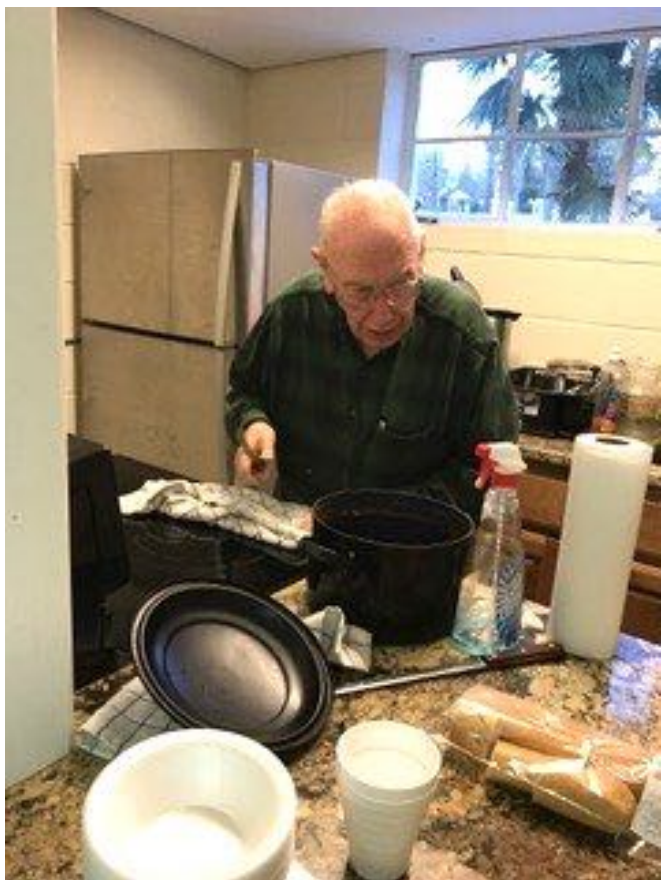

## *Palm Sunday to Easter*
