

On a cold evening in Lent the people from St. Alban's gathered in the undercroft for our first Lenten program. It was raining, with snow and sleet mixed in to make things interesting.

It was a good decision. Fifteen people were present for all or part of the evening. We ate an excellent meal, drank, talked, and were a community. I realized as I talked and listened that we were sharing our stories with each other, sharing who we were, where we are, and maybe where we are going.

## *From the Minutes of the Feb. 16 Vestry Meeting*

Motion was made and seconded to move the money willed to the church by Arnold Oglesby, which had previously been determined to be unrestricted, into the Merrill Lynch investment fund. Vestry approved the motion unanimously.

Mr. Duke and Mr. Jenkins presented wardens' reports. Mr. Duke greased the bell housing and eliminated the squeak. Mr. Jenkins noted the granite bench in memory of Marcia Jenkins will be installed before April 5. He will present some designs for the vestry to decide on.

Mrs. Seymour asked that Mrs. Keeler find out what SafeHouse Ministries' greatest needs are; Episcopal Charities did not provide any funding for the ministry for 2014, and the number of people who have sought help from SafeHouse has nearly doubled in the last year.

Discussion took place about what sort of meal/refreshments to provide when Bishop Don A. Wimberly visits on March 15. It was agreed that Fr. John will get in touch with Renee Hunt and get a price for an estimated thirty people.

Discussion took place about the kitchen remodeling. Mr. Romine has asked for a new quote from Jason Brady for a full upgrade to include opening the serving window, redoing cabinets, replacing sink, moving the old refrigerator, and adding new appliances. The cost is estimated at about \$12,000; over half the cost has been pledged. Mr. Jenkins suggested also using the money bequeathed to the church by Arnold Oglesby and dedicating the new kitchen to the memory of Arnold and Virginia Oglesby. Mr. Romine volunteered to serve as project manager. Motion was made and seconded to proceed with the new kitchen. The vestry approved the motion unanimously.

Vestry decided to resume the fifth Sunday get-togethers for food and fellowship. A potluck dinner after church is planned for March 29, which is also Palm Sunday.

## *Easter Season 2015*

In addition to the customary noon service for Ash Wednesday (February 18), St. Alban's joined with the Elberton First Methodist and First Presbyterian churches for a 6:30 p.m. service at the First Methodist Church. The order of service was a combined version of the observances of the three churches, and Fr. John delivered the sermon. Attendance was good (and reviews positive) despite chilly, windy weather.

We attempted a Shrove Tuesday pancake supper on February 17, but had to cancel it because of snow and ice threats. The first of five Lenten soup suppers was held on Wednesday February 25 when a surprising number braved snow flurries to eat Debra Romine's delicious Italian wedding soup. We deferred the first video program on the Promised Land until the next soup supper on March 4, when lucky attendees can catch a double-header (the programs, which focus on the journey of the people of Israel from the exodus to crossing the Jordan River, the wandering in the wilderness, are not very long).

Other soup suppers will take place at 6 p.m. on March 11, 18, and 25. Come and bring friends to eat good food and catch up on the wanderings of the Israelites.

Our Palm Sunday service is always a favorite of our congregation with the distribution of the palm branches (from our very own tree), the march into the church, and members taking parts in the Gospel reading. Since Palm Sunday falls on a fifth Sunday this year, the vestry has decided we will meet downstairs after the service for a potluck meal, an added bonus to the day.

Holy Week services will include the stripping of the altar on Maunday Thursday and a Good Friday service, both at 6 p.m. at St. Alban's (also tentative planning is underway for an ecumenical Good Friday service at noon). Then finally Easter Sunday will dawn, and we will celebrate the Resurrection, the event we have been leading up to and waiting for.
