Rector's Reflection



We celebrate All Saints Day the first of November. It's the day in our calendar when all the saints of the church are remembered and honored. We have lots of saints. They go back to the original apostles and those that came in contact with Jesus—some only briefly, like Veronica and Cornelius.

We know very little about some of the saints from the early centuries of the church, and what has come down to us is probably not true. If some of the stories are factual, they may well be composites of several lives.

We know more about the saints from the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. We know when they were born, what they did, and when they died. We celebrate and remember all of them on All Saints Day.

What does it mean to be a saint? There's more to it than being in a book or on a calendar. A good answer to the question is in the last verse of our hymn, "I Sing a Song of the Saints of God." Saints are people like us. They're people who have faith, people who perform acts of kindness, people who seek to know Jesus, people who make the decision to "be one too."

We've been given lots of examples, and new ones are added every year. Our job is to be like them.

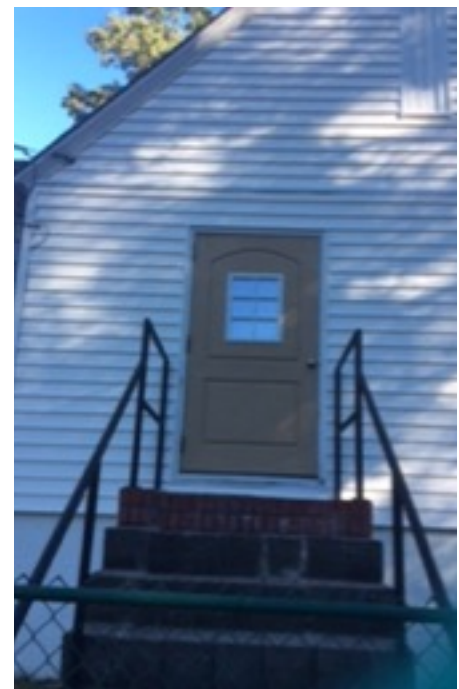
