

We have just finished the Triduum, three days, that falls at the end of October and the first of November each year. The first day is All Hallows' Eve, which falls on the day before All Saints' Day, always the first of November, followed by All Souls' Day.

## From October 8 Vestry Minutes

Charles Duke gave the senior warden's report. He is in the process of getting estimates for the tree touching the roof and for the rusted-out vent.

Fr. John Keeler gave the rector's report. He will be absent from St. Alban's the Sunday after Thanksgiving (November 26). Morning prayer will replace the Eucharist that day, which will be a white Sunday, after which we will go blue for Advent. The blessing of the animals is scheduled for this afternoon (October 8) at St. Andrew's barring rain.\* The Rev. Jim McCollough, pastor of First Methodist Church, and Fr. John are trying to form a ministerial association in Elbert County.

Under business, Charles reported that the church sign out by the fairgrounds is gone; Fr. John said he will call the city and ask for permission to replace it. We also need to check whether the church sign on the Lexington Highway is still there.

Anne Jaudon brought up the get-together at the church scheduled for October 29 at 5 p.m. She and Marilyn Slocumbe will confer on the menu. Charles agreed to make his ever-popular bread. Marilyn and Anne need a head count of how many will attend.

As an item of new business, Fr. John said it is about time to send out stewardship letters. He has been thinking about what to say. Charles suggested it would be good to explain St. Alban's finances and why members' contributions are needed.

The next meeting of the vestry was scheduled for November 19 after the service. There will be no December vestry meeting; the annual church meeting will take place in January.
